She has extensive research and field work experiences from both multi-cultural as well as low-resource settings and is collaborating with colleagues in Jordan, Sri Lanka, Nicaragua, Tanzania, Ethiopia, Mozambique and Somalia. Her research profile is related to SRHR in a globalized society with focus on maternal mortality, FGM/C, and honour violence, both in multicultural and limited resource settings.
